

Job Support Scheme HOW DOES THE SCHEME WORK?

How a salary is calculated

Beth normally works 5 days a week and earns £350 a week. Her company is suffering reduced sales due to coronavirus. Rather than making Beth redundant, the company puts Beth on the Job Support Scheme, working 2 days a week.



- Her employer pays Beth £140 for the <u>2 days</u> she works
- For the <u>3 days</u> she doesn't work Beth's employer will pay her 2/3 (or £140) of what she would normally earn
- The Government will give Beth's employer a grant worth £70 (1/3 of hours not worked)
- In total Beth earns £280 a week on the Job Support Scheme rather than her normal £350 a week.
