Job Support Scheme HOW DOES THE SCHEME WORK?

Employers facing decreased demand

Employers who are legally required to close their premises


JSS Open	JSS Closed
 Employee will need to work a minimum of 20% of their usual hours 	 Employee instructed to cease work in eligible (closed) premises
 Employee will receive two thirds of their normal pay for the hours not worked 	 Employee will receive two thirds of their normal pay for the hours not worked
 JSS paid by their employer and 61.67% of hours not worked funded by the government 	 JSS paid by their employer and fully funded by the government
 Employer will pay up to a maximum of £125 per month and the government will pay up to a maximum of £1,541.75 per month 	The government will pay up to a maximum of £2,083.33 per month
 Employer has discretion to pay more to the employee 	 Employer has discretion to pay more to the employee
 Neither employer nor employee needs to have benefitted from the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme to be eligible for JSS 	 Neither employer nor employee needs to have benefitted from the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme to be eligible for JSS



Job Support Scheme HOW DOES THE SCHEME WORK?

How a salary is calculated

Beth normally works 5 days a week and earns £300 a week. Her company is suffering reduced sales due to coronavirus. Rather than making Beth redundant, the company puts Beth on the Job Support Scheme, working 1 day a week.



- Her employer pays Beth £60 for the **1 day** she works
- For the <u>4 days</u> she doesn't work Beth's employer will pay her 2/3 (or £160) of what she would normally earn
- The Government will give Beth's employer a grant worth £148 (61.67% of hours not worked)
- In total Beth earns £220 a week on the Job Support Scheme rather than her normal £300 a week.
- The contribution from Beth's employer is £72 a week (+ National Insurance and pension)
